II. Opening Remarks: Meeting opened with Col McKibban's introduction and agenda review. This is the fourth iteration of the monthly town halls. Col McKibban mentioned the new plans to livestream the town halls but still asks members to make in-person attendance and thanked everyone in attendance for their time.

III. Agenda

- a. Military & Family Readiness Center: The M&FRC representative mentioned the upcoming events happening and discussed Military and Family Life Counselor resources, and resources available to members who are PCSing in and out of the ROK.
 - i. A representative from the Army Community Service (ACS) at Camp Humphreys briefed on resources available and the convenience some may have who are closer to transit to the Humphreys area, members are eligible for their services regardless of their service component.
- **b.** Legal Office: The legal office representative briefed legal assistance resources available for members stationed here at Osan.
- **c. Sexual Assault Prevention/Response:** The SAPR office representative discussed the services available in the office as well as the services and offices available for different demographics in the population (i.e. 18+, spouses, active duty, etc.).
- **d. Special Victims Counsel (SVC):** The SVC Representative briefed on the resources available from the Air and Space Force Victims' Counsel, discussed who the SVC can represent, and touched on the fact that issues needed to fall under the scope of military justice. He also broke down the process of how the SVC operates.
- **e. Equal Opportunity:** The EO representative discussed who the EO office supports. He briefed what categories fall within the scope of the EO office to investigate. He also spoke on the timelines member should remember when filing allegations.
- **f. School Liaison:** The school liaison discussed upcoming events. She also reminded members that space availability must be registered for each year.
- g. Child & Youth Programs: The Child & Youth Program representative discussed militarychildcare.com and the KINDEERSPOT app, where members can search for space available at future bases prior to PCS.
- h. Medical Group: The MDG representative briefed the upcoming sport physical rodeo and reminded members of primary care clinic walk in hours. Additionally, he provided a reminder for Space-A appointments, and Urgent Care Center and the optometry clinic operations.



i. What's Coming in Summer '24:

- i. Maj Gray reminded members to spread the word about monthly town halls as well as the Mustang One-Stop website.
- ii. The upcoming DoDEA scheduled was briefed through the Frist day of the AY 24-25 school year, to include the change of the venue for the upcoming graduation.
- **iii.** 51 FSS briefed events happening from May through June and reminded others to check out the FSS website for more information.
- iv. Lt Col Myers mentioned the ongoing construction projects, upcoming outages and how they will affect the base. He touched on the new round about in front of the Turumi Lodge and the expansion of parking and green spaces around the base. He also mentioned the construction projects that are projected to be completed prior to the end of the year, to include the CDC, DFAC, Bowling Alley and Gas Station.
- **v.** CES discussed the parking garage refresh and the ramp and stair updates from Seoraksan on the Commissary. He provided an update to the installation of cordless blinds which has been pushed, dates can be found in the Tow hall slides.
- vi. Maj Gray closed the Summer updates with a quick overview of the upcoming summer exercise schedule and updates with the Communication Action Plan to include minor updates made to the web page and the addition of the Out-Processing section which will aid members as they depart and upcoming touchpoints.

IV. Q& A Forum:

i. Question: Turpentine smell in the parking garage, is it safe

1. Answer: A new epoxy is being put down on the walking surface and is of no concern.

ii. Question: Can ROKAF/Security forces direct traffic at the ROK Gates?

1. Answer: Col McKibban discussed that SF and the ROK MPs are collaborating to address the traffic issues. The ROKAF Team is open to mitigation efforts to improve traffic measures.

iii. Question: Is there a specific reason why they do not open the outbound ROK gate?

1. Answer: Col McKibban relayed this is due to the ROKAF MP's policies and operations. Chief Trundle reminded attendees that the ROKAF gate is not ours to control, and it is a courtesy for our usage.

iv. Question: Are there any updates with the bus route in Godeok?

1. Answer: Resources and funding are being worked to make this happen.

v. Question: Does the JAG office assist members who are non-Command Sponsored?

1. Answer: JA does assist Non-CSP members, mostly everyone at Osan is eligible for JA assistance with very few exceptions.

vi. Question: Is it true that there are tickets for the OHS graduation, limitations on attendance?

1. Answer: Currently it is not being ticketed, but members are being asked to prioritize by providing the names for 10 members they wish to attend in preparation for potential space limitations. More guidance to come on this question.



vii. Question: Are members at Osan able to get the MFR that is offered at Camp Humphreys and Kunsan to document the poor Air Quality Index (AQI)?

- 1. Answer: Col McKibban explained that we are not taking a blanket approach to automatically document the AQI exposure for members stationed here at Osan. However, members are encouraged to seek medical attention if they have any health concerns.
- 2. Answer: Capt Shuman mentioned that the MDG is not accepting any AQI MFRs to be input in member's medical records.

viii. Question: Is there an update for the bugs being found in the dried goods at the commissary?

1. Answer: The Commissary team investigated the dried goods and did not find any issues with insects.

ix. Question: Is the window closed for summer job hires?

- 1. Answer: Yes, the window has closed for summer.



 - Advocacy for your voice & choice
 - Advice on the <u>military justice</u> (investigation and prosecution) process
 - Legal representation in law enforcement interviews, hearings, and military trials
- Survivors of Interpersonal Violence & Sexual Harassment (Art 134, UCMJ) may get:
 - Confidential legal advice on rights and process during one-time appointment



- Victims' Counsels <u>only</u> represent their client, and <u>cannot</u> be influenced by your or the offender's chain of command
- · Victims' Counsels have an independent chain of command in Washington, DC
- If a <u>dependent</u> victim wants VC services, the person under investigation must be on Title
 10 orders at the time of the misconduct.
- To request a Victims' Counsel for a restricted or unrestricted report: Contact SARC, FAP, VWAP Coordinator (legal office).
- To file a restricted report: SARC, Victim Advocate, Chaplain, or healthcare provider.
